Community Partner of the Year

The Community Partner of the Year Award recognizes those outside Nebraska's network of domestic violence/sexual assault programs who have shown a commitment to ending dating violence, domestic violence, sexual violence, and stalking through excellent service to survivors, partnership and collaboration

with network programs, and/or the use of innovative outreach and prevention strategies.

Nominees may include, but are not limited to, church or other community groups; allied professionals such as mental health practitioners, teachers, law enforcement officers, child protection workers, or health care providers; and agencies or organizations such as law enforcement, schools or human services.
